Open Class General Rules and Regulations:

Exhibit Building will be Open 9am to 8:00pm daily from Tuesday, July 16, thru Sunday, July 21.

Open to residents of Clarke County, plus those living in adjacent counties with youth enrolled and exhibiting in Clarke County 4-H and FFA.

All exhibits may be entered between 8am and 12pm on Monday July 15.

Judging is at 1:00pm Monday, July 15. No pre-registration is required. Exhibits will be released and can be claimed between 7:00pm and 9:00pm Sunday, July 21. Exhibits must be claimed between 9am and 10am on Monday, July 22 or will become the property of the fair board to be disposed of at their discretion.

Scrapbook pages must be in a plastic sleeve. A 2-page spread must be of the same subject. No limit on the number of classes entered. **There will be no entry fees and no premiums. The ribbons awarded will be Red, Blue and Best of Show. Best of Show will be awarded at the judge's discretion.** Best of Show will be selected for each of the following categories: Culinary, Needlecraft, Crafts/Hobbies, Photography, Fine Arts, Floriculture, Horticulture, and Genealogy. The decision of the judge is final, not every exhibit will necessarily receive a ribbon. When there is only one entry of a kind, the judge is not obligated to award a ribbon unless deserved. Each entry must be the work of the exhibitor. The board of directors and superintendents will use all diligence to ensure the safety of articles after their arrival but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibitors must give personal attention to the property and immediately preceding the close of the fair, take charge of the same.

No exhibitor is to make a comment during the judging. If so, exhibits will be disqualified. Any questions may be presented to the judge at close of judging.

Persons interested directly in the premiums in any department must not act as a judge in that department. The Clarke County Fair Board will supply judges for each department as far as possible.

All classes are the same for all categories: Unless specified. Youth-11 and under; Teen-12 to 18; Anyone 62 and over is considered Senior Citizens if they choose; Special Friends are those with special needs or who require assistance with their talents. Y=Youth; T=Teen; A=Adult; SC=Senior Citizens; SF=Special Friends; CF=Care Facility. It is optional to exhibit in Open Classes or Senior Citizen Classes, but not in both.

Extension office has pamphlets on preparing vegetables and flowers for show.

Superintendents and/or Fair Board are not responsible in case of theft or breakage.

Rules for Culinary Arts

There will be no entry fees and no premiums. Ribbons only will be awarded. Best of Show will be awarded at the judge's discretion. Baked items may be entered Monday, July 10 between 8am and 12pm. Judging will be after 1:00pm Monday, July 10. Exhibitor may pick up baked goods as soon as all food items have been judged, not before judging is over. Only a portion of the baked items will be retained for exhibition. NOTE: Any baked item not picked up by 7pm July 12 will be disposed of. Items not kept for judging could be donated to the 4-H bake sale. Entries must have been prepared since last year's fair. Entry tag is to be placed on the OUTSIDE of each container. All baked goods are to be in ZIP LOCK BAGS. If it is a canned item, it must have gummed label. All canned projects must provide two (2) jars (one to exhibit and one to be opened by the judge for judging). Opened jars can be picked up after judging. All canned goods need to be properly sealed with the screw bands left on the jars. All Canned items must have a card attached with the following information: **Method of Preservation, Processing Time, Date Processed, and a List of Ingredients.** Jars may be opened for judging. All products must be in standard quart or pint jars except jams and jellies which may be in smaller glasses. All baked products are to be placed on paper plates or paper board with entry tags attached with the recipes used. Please use the 6 or 9-inch paper plates. Exhibitor's name should be put in an inconspicuous place on the container. Pies are the only baked product to be judged in container in which they were baked. Pies will be judged on the filling and pie crust. **No cream filling or pecan pies. We cannot accept any entries that have been put on ice or in a cooler.**

No bread mixes, cake mixes, frosting mixes/pre-made frosting, and prepared pie fillings allowed, except where it has been specified. Please use a cake pan size according to recipe. Entries using uncooked eggs or cream cheese will not be accepted. Cream Cheese mints will be accepted if there is at least 1-cup sugar to 8 oz. cream cheese.

All entries MUST be accompanied by the recipe on a 3"x5" or 4"x6" recipe card, including the recipe for pie crusts.

When there is only one entry of a kind, the judge is not obligated to award a ribbon unless deserved. A Best of Show ribbon will be awarded at the judge's discretion. All articles and garments must have an entry tag secured to it. Any name tags on articles or garments must be covered. Each article entered must be the work of the exhibitor and shown in neat and clean condition. We reserve the right not to judge a dirty article. Please tell if item is special to you or who will be using the item.

Found and finished quilt: Quilt blocks/tops "found" and finished for/by you or someone else.

Crochet: All doilies and centerpieces must be mounted on colored paper or cardboard. Centerpiece is 14" in diameter and over. Doily is 14" in diameter and under.

FLORICULTURE AND HORTICULTURE

All specimens must have been grown by the exhibitor or someone who has taken active part in the work. Floriculture exhibits will exhibit in clear glass container, sized for specimen in class exhibited. Please add rocks or marbles for weight so they will not tip over.

Horticulture exhibits must be on paper plate. All varieties must be true to name. If you are not sure of variety, enter under "other". The superintendent shall have the right to remove an exhibit if it becomes unsightly. Exhibitors may replace wilted flowers, after judging, if they wish. Double potting is permissible for container plants. Prepare fruits and vegetables as for market.

Do not trim tops too close on root crops (1 inch to 1 ½ inches is best) or trim or peel cabbage too close – uniformity and quality are main points. Potatoes brushed, not washed, and onions not peeled.

Herbs: Shown at the stage they are used. One sprig or stem unless otherwise stated. Exhibit in narrow bottle filled with water.

Container Gardens: Collection of assorted plants. Use a container of your choice.

Flower Arrangements: Open to all ages. Artistic entry must be done by the exhibitor. Flowers, dried, treated and plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor. No Noxious weeds are allowed. Be sure to mark your containers and accessories on the bottom.

A minimum amount of painting will be permitted on dried or treated materials. All exhibits must be kept in good condition throughout the show. Wilted material must be replaced each day. Nothing can be removed from an exhibit without the Superintendent's permission. The Superintendent shall have the right to remove or exclude from the hall, at any time, any exhibit or part thereof which is unsightly.

In all artistic design divisions fresh and/or dried plant material is required in all classes. No potted plants. A minimum amount of painting is permitted on dried plant material in all classes. No painting is permitted on fresh plant material. One or more accessories are permitted if so desired, unless otherwise stated. Contrived flowers may be used. Only real feathers permitted. No artificial flowers, foliage or primary and secondary noxious weeds are permitted in any classes. Backgrounds, containers, bases, etc., portraying the American flag will be permitted in any exhibit only if they are done tastefully. Extension office has pamphlets for preparing vegetables and flowers for show. **Superintendents and/or Fair Board are not responsible in case of theft or breakage.**

When selecting entries for exhibit, the condition and uniformity of size are factors in judging, so choose carefully. Table use size is preferred. Vegetables may be washed, but not scrubbed. Do not remove husks from corn or skin from onions. A strip of corn husk is to be peeled back sufficiently so the judge may see the top of each ear and condition of kernels. Extension office has pamphlets on how to prepare vegetables for show.

GENEALOGY

There will be no entry fees and no premiums. Ribbons only will be awarded. Best of Show will be awarded at the judge's discretion. Each class is open to any age. Both the Item and the Description will be considered when judging. Diligence will be used to ensure the safety of articles after their arrival and placement, but in no case, will the Clarke Co. Fair Board be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Copies of photos, documents or research material are preferred. Original documents are discouraged. Please protect photos and documents with glassed frames, or plastic sleeve (Ziploc Bags). All entries MUST be accompanied by a written statement, giving (at minimum) a description of exhibit, why it is important to the exhibitor, and the relationship between the exhibitor and any ancestors or other relatives included in the display.

Written statements may vary in length, a 3x5 card to an 8 ½ x 11 page. Only the exhibits entered in Class F need to have a Clarke County connection.

Old Documents: Documents must be predominantly displayed. Exhibit must be constructed so that all elements are visible at the same time and should not be included in a book or folder. Documents may include: Military, will, birth record, marriage license, probate record, land documents, teaching certificate, diploma.

Pedigree/Ancestor Chart: Show Parents, Grandparents, Great Grandparents, etc. of an individual.

Family Records/Religious Records: May include, Diary, daily record cookbooks occasional cards, school, letters, invitations postcards, confirmation, church, baptism, bible.

Genealogy Research Notebook or Scrapbook: Must be created by exhibitor. Notebook or Scrapbook may include family group sheets, clippings, computer generated lists, etc.

Pictorial family history or photo display: 2 or more items and must be predominantly photographic material. Exhibits must be constructed so that all elements are visible at the same time and should not be included in a book or folder.

Poster or Display of Research Material: Exhibit must be constructed so that all elements are visible at the same time and should not be included in a book or folder.

Heirlooms: All entries must be of a genealogical nature.

Each entry should be accompanied with information showing its family connection to the exhibitor, and how it has helped the exhibitor understand and appreciate his/her family history.

Heirloom Display: May include a limited number of supporting photos, documents, etc. Exhibit must be constructed so that all elements are visible at the same time and should not be included in a book or folder. Grandparent pictures may include one or two people.
